Update on digital camera release

TOKYO – Nikon Corporation today announces delays in the release of new digital cameras and the effects of the 2016 Kumamoto earthquakes.

Delays in the release of new digital cameras

The new Nikon compact digital cameras, COOLPIX A300 and B500 will now be available in May 2016 and the COOLPIX A900 and B700 will be arriving in July. Furthermore, the Nikon KeyMission 360 action camera will now be available in October 2016 as more time is required for software adjustment.

In addition, the three new premium compact cameras, Nikon DL18-50 f/1.8-2.8, DL24-85 f/1.8-2.8, and DL24-500 f/2.8-5.6, originally scheduled for a June 2016 release, will be delayed due to serious issues with the integrated circuit for image processing built into the cameras. The new release date has yet to be determined, however, we will announce this information as soon as it is confirmed.

The effects of the 2016 Kumamoto earthquakes

Nikon would like to offer their sincerest sympathies to those affected by the 2016 Kumamoto earthquakes. We hope that the recovery process in the disaster area proceeds swiftly.

In light of the earthquakes, which started on April 14th the suppliers of parts for Nikon products such as digital cameras with interchangeable lenses, interchangeable lenses, and compact digital cameras, which include those mentioned above, have been affected and as such will inevitably impact our production and supplies.

We are currently investigating the situation, and we will announce the details as soon as they are confirmed.

We apologise to our customers, business partners and all those who have expressed interest in these models for the delays. We are making every effort to bring these models to market at the earliest possible date without compromising on our standards and the total Nikon product experience.
